II- Institutional and academic news

a) Institutional:

- New sponsorships: next year, there will be 262 Germinare students in secondary school. To date, we have made 222 sponsorship proposals, some already confirmed and others still to be confirmed. We still need to secure 49 to cover all our students needs in 2020.
- **New corporate sponsorships**: Disney, Pacheco Trade Center, Credit Suisse and Bumeran.

- Procedural Handbook: we are developing with Profesor Juan Ruibal, as external consultant, an "Agents for Change" Programme Handbook. Ruibal is a member of the ESEADE Education Management School, directed by Gustavo Iaies. This procedural manual is key to successful replicating "Agents for Change" Programme.
- Anual Fundraising Dinner: it was a very important night for Germinare. An opportunity to
 present our results and raise funds for our beneficiaries' families. We also shared a story
 about two of Germinare's families.
- b) Academic:

"Agents for Change"

- Student admission outcome 2019: the process is almost complete. Leveling stage is due to start in January, until their entry to assigned quality schools in March 2021. Close to 80 students are due to begin "Agents for Change" Programme this year.
- Students secondary school entry 2020: our 17th group of students is about to complete the Leveling stage; 52 students will join new schools as "Agents for Change" in Campana, Pilar, Tigre and City of Buenos Aires.
- "Agents for Change" graduates 2019: 28 secondary students graduated this year and will continue their higher studies in the "Alumni Network". Listen to their thoughts at Germinare's graduation Ceremony.






